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Dear Sirs,

I am writing on behalf of Mr Dennis Fielder, majority shareholder of Kwamtili Estate Ltd., P.O. Box 120, Tanga, Tanzania, who is currently residing in the UK.

This letter concerns two mortgages taken out by the FMO. Copies of the two titles and the accompanying entries in the Land Registry are attached. The titles are Title No. 14501 where the mortgage was registered on 8 March 1976 and Title No. 4722 where the mortgage was registered on the same date.

The mortgages were the result of a finance agreement for DFL 53000 in 1975. The FMO then agreed to capitalisation of the interest and part conversion of the loan into capital with deferred payment of the interest.

Mr Fielder wrote in 2010 asking the FMO to discharge these two mortgages since the loans to Kwamtili Estate Ltd had been capitalised. So far he has had no reply.

I would be very grateful if you could look into the matter. The correspondence establishing the loan and the mortgages were referenced under JA/Boi/Brn/TA1 in a letter from R. Wiessing of 7 July 1988.

From early-1987 to late-1988 there were a series of invoices submitted by FMO to Kwamtili Estate Ltd. for travel costs. The references on the letters accompanying these invoices were FA/Vdi/Löb, FA/Löb/and FA/Ahh.

It is extremely important that the mortgages be discharged. Kwamtili Estate sits at the centre of a strategic watershed in an area of exceptional biodiversity. There is currently considerable pressure on the large area of untouched forest that covers much of the estate to the extent that without a solid legal basis for future investment, the entire forest will disappear within a few years.
